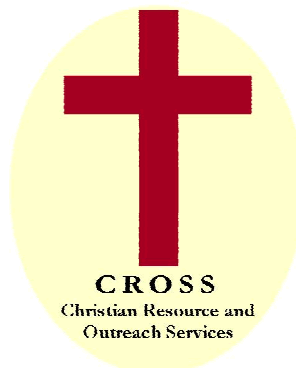


Board of Directors

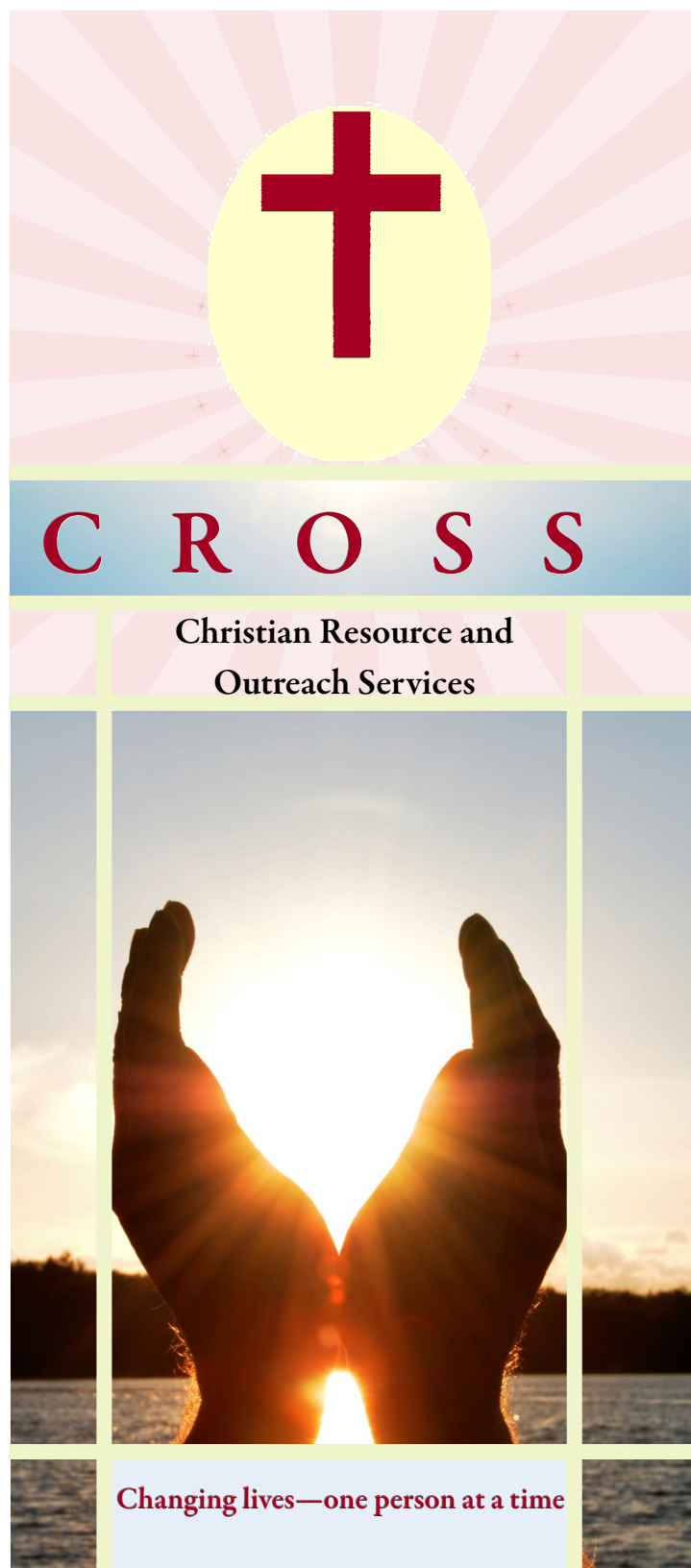

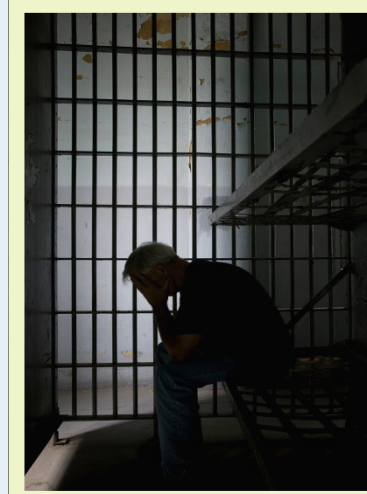
- **Calhoun Christian Women’s Job Corps (CWJC)** and **Christian Men’s Job Corps (CMJC)** provide a Christian-based life and employment skills training to women and men in need and to those who desire a positive change in life. CWJC and CMJC are a poverty-to-work ministry that combines practical training, relationship building,

emotional healing, and spiritual growth to meet a person’s physical and eternal needs.

NEW **Calhoun County Jail Chaplain** delivers pastoral care, manages religious programs, and administers resources at the Calhoun County Jail. The Jail Chaplain serves inmates of all faiths and the correctional staff officers. He also is available for personal counseling and crisis intervention guidance, as appropriate.



- **World Changers** is a Southern Baptist North American Mission Board initiative which CROSS and the Calhoun Baptist Association participates in annually. World Changers gets students out of the classroom and into a hands-on mission experience through repairing (e.g.; roofing, painting) houses of local residents. The main focus is changing the lives of the participants by giving them an opportunity to change

someone else’s world. (New projects will begin July 18–25, 2009.)

- **Greater Good/United Way of East Central Alabama/Gifts In Kind Annis-ton** is an authorized affiliate of Gifts In Kind International—a philanthropic organization that receives new product donations (e.g.; furniture, clothing, household appliances) from large and small companies. Products received are provided to people in need at no cost. During Hurricane Katrina Greater Good received and distributed furniture, clothing, and household items to the evacuees.

- **Reaching Communities in Need (RECON)** is a cooperative home rehab ministry modeled after World Changers. RECON uses volunteer labor to do home repairs for those who qualify. Funding for building materials and administrative costs is provided through CROSS designated gifts and the local churches.
